



Civil Construction Apprenticeship Program Overview

Hazell Bros offers three-year apprenticeships in the civil construction industry working on a variety of infrastructure projects. The civil construction industry includes the planning, creation and maintenance of public infrastructure (basically anything that will make peoples lives easier!)

As an apprentice with us, you would be part of a team working on major works infrastructure projects, civil works and/or ground services projects.

We require our apprentices to have a current driver's licence (or ability to get one), good communication skills, a willingness to learn and try new things, enjoy problem solving, be a team player, be able to calculate materials etc., enjoy working outdoors, operate heavy plant and machinery and have a genuine desire to learn about and work in the civil construction industry.

GENERAL

- Assisting the team with civil works including road works projects, construction and maintenance
- Operating heavy plant and machinery
- Constructing form work
- Placing and finishing concrete
- Interpreting plans
- Using GPS technology
- Traffic management
- Laying road pavement
- Laying pipes
- Working in confined spaces

STRUCTURES

A hands-on apprenticeship in civil construction to service some of Tasmania's largest major works projects. Skills will be developed combining on and off the job learning under a mentor.

Typical tasks include:

- Assisting the team on major infrastructure projects such as bridges, reservoirs, windfarms and overpasses
- Steel structure fixing
- Constructing form work
- Placing and finishing concrete
- Operating heavy plant and machinery
- Dogging and rigging
- Interpreting plans
- Using GPS technology
- Traffic management
- Working at heights

DRAINAGE

A hands-on apprenticeship in civil construction to service some of Tasmania's largest development sites including roads, council assets, storm water systems/pits. Skills will be developed combining on and off the job learning under a mentor.

Typical tasks include:

- Assisting the team with ground works and major infrastructure projects such as road works and maintenance
- Constructing form work
- Placing and finishing concrete
- Laying road pavement
- Interpreting plans
- Trenching, laying pipes including sewerage, water mains, stormwater etc.
- Ground services fault finding
- Traffic management
- Using GPS Technology
- Operating heavy plant and machinery
- Working in confined spaces

Statewide travel may be required depending upon project location.
